Last week, the International Fencing Federation (FIE) announced the death of its Honorary President, Rolland

Boitelle, at the age of 83. He was FIE President from 1985 to 1992. In the 1950s, he was Paris sabre champion, then went on to be an international referee for over 30 years. Captain of the French foil team from 1955 to 1976, he was Secretary General of the French Fencing Federation from 1978 to 1981, before serving as its President from 1981 to 1984. Boitelle was also Secretary General, then Vice-President, of the French NOC from 1982 to 1988.



Brazilians Kaká and Marta were elected, respectively, FIFA World Player and FIFA Women's World Player for 2007 by the *Fédération Internationale* de *Football*

World Champions. This is the fourth year running that Federer has received this honour, and the third time overall for Henin. In men's doubles, Americans Bob and Mike Bryan, and in women's, Cara Black (Zimbabwe) and Liezel Huber (USA) were awarded the titles. Ricardas Berankis (Lithuania) and Urszula Radwanska (Poland) won awards in the junior category and Shingo Kunieda (Japan) and Esther Vergeer (Netherlands) in the wheelchair tennis category. All these winners will receive their trophies at an ITF dinner to be held on 3 June 2008 in Paris
